(Salt Lake City, UT)

The Pingree Center is Utah's leading autism elementary program for the treatment of children and adolescents with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD). The Center provides comprehensive treatment, education, and related services for children with autism and their families.

Our local AEC facility in Salt Lake City held a drive for donations for the Center's new adult education program as well as made a charitable donation to support the school.

This Autism Treatment Center uses and develops best practices validated by research while treating students and their families with dignity and respect. The Center undertakes and supports research to better understand autism, its causes, and the most effective treatments and interventions for individuals with autism.
